


Compared with other types of housing and land tenure: did people living in Collaborative Housing forms have advantages in coping with the pandemic?

Online survey to over 1000 people from 72 countries (sept-nov 2020) + 52 interviews to survey respondents

The survey was not conducted on a statistically representative sample of the world's or a country's population (gender, age, type of housing, etc.).

Shows trends in situations in different regions and by type of housing tenure in the context of the pandemic.



Learning 1. People in Housing Cooperatives and Community Land Trust (collective land ownership) didn't get threatened with eviction / foreclosure

Threats of eviction between march and sept. 2020 (%)
